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Introduction

STC's Salary Database is a new tool that members can use to conduct more powerful job searches, make a strong case for a raise, or prepare department payroll budgets. The Salary Database replaces STC's annual salary survey. Drawing on data drawn from the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) Occupational Employment Statistics (OES), the Salary Database provides more reliable data collected at a much finer level of detail than was possible with STC's old survey.

Highlights of the Salary Database include the following:

- Data on both salary and hourly wages, so they're equally useful for consultants, who are usually paid by the hour
- Full annual salary data for all 153 U.S. metropolitan areas in which writers worked in 2005 and 2006
- Full annual salary data for all U.S. states for 2005 and 2006
- Full annual salary data for all eighty-four industries that employ technical writers for 2005 and 2006

Where do the data come from?

BLS collects data on 801 occupations and professions from 1.25 million business establishments in all fifty states plus the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico. BLS produces this data through its Occupational Employment Statistics program (www.bls.gov/oes/). The data are presented as a series of interactive tables on the BLS Web site (www.bls.gov/oes/current/oes273042.htm).

What's so great about the BLS data?

Following are the five most important advantages of using BLS data:

1. The amount and granularity of the data allow for much more meaningful comparisons of salary information across geographic areas and industries. The BLS data for technical writers cover eighty-four industries, all 11 combined statistical areas and 153 metropolitan areas. (Note: the old STC salary survey provided no comparison of salary information across industries.)
2. Because the BLS data come from company HR departments, the data are considered more reliable than survey data collected directly from employees.
3. The BLS survey focuses on the *duties and job functions* of employees, not on their titles. Titles can be misleading because they do not consistently reflect responsibilities—for example, one company's manager is another's director. The BLS data show how other employees with similar duties are compensated, and therefore provide a more effective basis for comparison.
4. The BLS data include information only on salaries and wages. Data on benefits and other compensation, which might skew results, are not included.
5. The BLS data include both annual *and* hourly salary information. This means that the data are equally useful for both full-time salaried employees and contractors who need to calculate hourly rates.

What's a Combined Statistical Area?

A combined statistical area, or CSA, is one of the eleven major metropolitan areas in the United States. CSA data transcend state boundaries and provide a macro-level view of technical writers' salaries in what is commonly seen as a single labor market. For example, the CSA for the New York City area includes New York City, northern New Jersey, Long Island, northeastern Pennsylvania, and parts of Connecticut.



What's a Metropolitan Statistical Area?

A metropolitan statistical area, or MSA, provides a finer level of salary data for a smaller geographic region within a CSA. For example, the following MSAs are included in the CSA for New York City:

- Nassau and Suffolk counties
- New York City, White Plains, and Wayne (NJ)
- Bridgeport, Stamford, and Norwalk (CT)
- Scranton-Wilkes Barre, PA



Some MSAs are labeled "Metropolitan Division" and some are labeled "NECTA Division." What do these terms mean?

BLS uses the designations "Metropolitan Division" and "NECTA Division" to distinguish MSAs from similarly (and sometimes identically) named CSAs. For example, the CSA for Los Angeles-Long Beach-Santa Ana, in California, includes an MSA for Los Angeles-Long Beach-Glendale. BLS appends "Metropolitan Division" to the MSA so that it won't be confused with the larger CSA.

A NECTA, which stands for New England City or Town Area, is analogous to an MSA. Employment statistics for metropolitan areas in New England use towns as building blocks instead of counties. Throughout the Salary Database, some metropolitan areas of New England are designated "NECTA Division" to distinguish them from similarly named CSAs.

What's an NAICS code?

The North American Industrial Classification System, or NAICS, is used to describe economic activity in Canada, Mexico, and the U.S. Every industry has an NAICS code. The BLS data for technical writers include salary information at two-digit, three-digit, and four-digit NAICS code levels. For example, the classification for the Finance and Insurance industry looks like this:

Industry 52: Finance and Insurance
Sector 522: Credit Intermediation and Related Activities
Sector 523: Securities, Commodity Contracts, and Other Financial Investment Activities
Sector 524: Insurance Carriers and Related Activities
Subsector 5241: Insurance Carriers
Subsector 5242: Agencies, Brokerages, and Other Insurance Activities

Please note: BLS adds two trailing zeros to four-digit NAICS codes and three trailing zeros for three-digit NAICS codes. However, BLS does not add trailing digits to two-digit NAICS codes. The STC Salary Database follows this convention to preserve consistency with BLS reports.

Why is some of the data suppressed?

To protect the confidentiality of very large employers, the BLS must sometimes suppress the publication of some data. Publishing the average salaries in an MSA where technical writers are heavily concentrated in one or two firms would essentially give away the salary scales of one employer to the other, who could easily subtract out the numbers it reported to figure out what the other is paying. In such cases, the Bureau suppresses the data. In the tables provided by STC you will occasionally see fields marked with “***”. These are data that have been suppressed.

When data are suppressed, calculating a percentage change from 2005 to 2006 is sometimes not possible. The label “NA” is used to indicate that the percentage change calculation cannot be made for a particular industry.

Critical to interpreting these higher ranges is understanding that, to be considered a technical writer, the actual writing process needs to account for a plurality of the total functions the worker performs. A senior executive who oversees a team of technical writers but who does not actually engage in any part of the creative process is not included in these estimates.

Why are salaries in the Salary Database lower than reported in the most recent STC salary survey?

In any discussion about the differences in salary reporting between the old STC survey and the new Salary Database, it's important to note the dangers of focusing on averages. STC's last salary survey contained information from only 2,300 respondents—a drop in the bucket compared to the Salary Database, which includes data collected from 1.25 million business establishments. With small datasets, distortions are inevitable.

For example, California was by far the highest-paying state for technical writers in 2005, and one-quarter of the respondents to STC's 2005 salary survey were from California. But according to BLS, in 2005 only 15.5 percent of all U.S. technical writers were based in California. The over-representation of Californians—coupled with the under-representation of lower-compensated Texans, who made up the second-largest contingent of technical writers but whose annual salary ranked 23rd out of fifty states in 2005—are two reasons why the STC survey reported an artificially high average annual salary for the entire U.S.

Precisely because the old survey was open to misinterpretation, STC decided to move to a new system using more comprehensive data. The BLS datasets are so large and are published at such a fine level of detail that they eliminate the danger that a single well-compensated group could skew the results. In statistics, this is called the “law of large numbers.”

What are percentiles?

A *percentile* indicates the percentage of a distribution that is equal to or below a given value. As already discussed, actual titles can often be ambiguous indicators of a worker's responsibilities and skill. The BLS data are organized according to the following percentiles:

- 10th percentile: ten percent of the responses were equal to or below this value; ninety percent were above this value. This is often interpreted as an entry-level salary.
- 25th percentile: twenty-five percent of the responses were equal to or below this value; seventy-five percent were above this value. This can be interpreted as a journeyman-level salary.
- Median: fifty percent of the responses were equal to or below this value; fifty percent were above this value.
- 75th percentile: seventy-five percent of the responses were equal to or below this value; twenty-five percent were above this value. We can interpret this as a management salary.
- 90th percentile: only ten percent of respondents reported to have a salary equal to or greater than this. These are interpreted as senior management salaries.

Other factors contributed to the differences in salary reporting between the old STC survey and the new Salary Database:

- The STC survey was sent only to members, who, by the very fact of their membership in STC, tend to take the profession more seriously—and therefore tend to be better compensated.
- Studies show that employees tend to inflate salaries when reporting on surveys.
- The BLS data rely on the U.S. government's definition of *technical writer*. For example, when companies fill out the BLS survey, they are asked to state what they pay employees who perform the duties listed in the definition for technical writer found in the BLS *Occupational Outlook Handbook*:

Write technical manuals, such as equipment manuals, appendices, or operating and maintenance instructions. May assist in layout work.

This outdated definition leaves out many of the additional responsibilities required of today's technical communicators—usability testing, contributing to product development, and multimedia skills, to name just a few. Technical communicators who perform these skills are more highly compensated—and more likely to have responded to the old STC survey—than the technical writers on which the BLS data are based. In short, the

old survey shows higher compensation because it was gathering data from a broader range of workers than the BLS survey.

The downward bias of this limited definition on the reported salaries is one of the primary reasons why STC petitioned the government to change the definition. Currently, the government is considering adding a new, more accurate definition of *technical communicator* to the BLS list of emerging professions in O*NET, the BLS's online and career data source. Do the salary data reflect total compensation?

No. The numbers presented represent salary data only and do not include health or retirement benefits, training and education budgets, and professional fees (such as STC dues coverage), as well as commuting costs. Anyone looking for work

needs to put these data within the context of a complete compensation package.

How are annual wages calculated?

Annual wages have been calculated by multiplying the hourly mean wage by 2,080 hours. Where an hourly mean wage is not published, the annual wage has been directly calculated from the reported survey data.

Do the hourly data reflect the per-hour rates of contractors?

No. Most contractors spend 25 to 30 percent of their time on marketing and administrative functions—tasks which are not billed to clients. For this reason, for a contractor to make the same as a full-time worker over the course of a year, the contractor's billable per-hour rate must be higher.

The hourly wage data presented here do not reflect this. Consequently, the hourly data are probably more reflective of part-time employee wages than independent contractor compensation. A contractor's per-hour rate would be adjusted upward to reflect time spent for marketing, administration, and other non-billable hours.

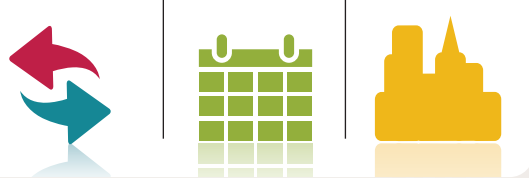

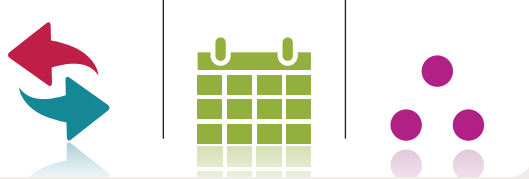
